The seed money amount to put on WNIRCNA has not increased in over 20 years while the costs to put on the convention just continue to multiply. This increase will not eliminate the need to fundraise, but will help ensure that host committees can get off to a better start. C&E will continue to have extensive conversation about the future of WNIRCNA but increasing seed money will help to secure the future of one of our regions longest running conventions.

I would also talk about the river float on Friday July 11 from 12-3 prior to region - at Roza Recreation park in Yakima - \$30 gets you a tube and transportation back to starting point -- This is a great way to get to know people before the business of RSC starts.
